



## BREWNZ BEER AWARDS 2010

### Pricing

Price per entry: NZ\$125 (if received by 16 July 2010)  
NZ\$175 (if received by 31 July 2010)

*[After 8 beers are entered any subsequent entries (submitted in one go) attract a 50% discount]*

Payment is preferred by credit card (VISA or MasterCard) using the online entry process. Please note that only fully paid entries will be judged.

### Australian Entries

Entries are preferred in bottled form. If your product is not available in bottles then kegs may be used but there will be an additional charge of NZ\$10 per entry to cover handling. Cask conditioned ales may be entered and will also be subject to the NZ\$10 surcharge. A minimum of 4 litres of each beer entered is required for judging.

Breweries can send their beer to this point where it will be handled (with care) and consolidated onto pallets for shipment to New Zealand. The charge for this will be NZ\$30.00 per entry. Please note this service is only available for bottled beer. **If you are planning to send a keg you must arrange shipping by your own means.** To take advantage of this offer the entries will need to be paid for and delivered to the University of Ballarat by 6 August 2010. For export documentation purposes please note on the outside of each package the exhibit name, volume, alcohol content, and dollar value.

## Judging

Gold medal = 3 points  
Silver medal = 2 points  
Bronze medal = 1 point  
No medal = 0 points

Class, Style and Subcategory is to be chosen from the style guidelines (which can be downloaded from the BGNZ website) and are based on those from the World Beer Cup, with the addition of four NZ specific styles.

## Champion International Brewery

A trophy is available for "Champion International Brewery". This trophy is designed exclusively to reward entrants whose beers are not currently commercially available in New Zealand (and who are therefore ineligible to win any of the other trophies). The trophy will be awarded to the brewery with the highest average score across its three highest scoring entries. To be eligible a brewery must have a minimum of three beers entered.
